Free Skin & Prostate Cancer Screenings planned October 8th & 22nd

(September 26, 2022) – The Tammy Walker Cancer Center, 511 S. Santa Fe Ave., Salina, will host free screenings for skin and prostate cancer on two Saturday's in October. The screenings will take place Saturday, Oct. 8th, and Saturday, Oct. 22nd, from 9 a.m. to noon each day. Space is limited and appointments are required by calling Daniel Craig, Tammy Walker Cancer Center Cancer Outreach Coordinator, at (785) 452-4848.

Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer found in both men and women. People of all ages should have moles and other unusual skin changes evaluated by a professional.

Prostate cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer death in American men behind lung cancer. The prostate cancer screening is for men ages 55 to 69 and includes a PSA blood test and physical exam. Prior to testing, men will have the opportunity to consult with a urologist to help decide if the screening is appropriate and desirable.

Both skin and prostate cancers can be cured if found early.

The screenings are held in partnership with Salina Masonic Lodge No. 60, Masonic Cancer Alliance and the University of Kansas Cancer Center. The event is open to the public. Masks will be required following COVID-19 safety guidelines for healthcare facilities.
